Awande is 3 years old and lives in Cape Town, South Africa.

- ★ In what ways is she like you? (e.g. she's a girl, she's three, she has brown eyes, she wears jeans)
- ▶ What other words would you use to describe Awande?

## 2 AWANDE'S MUM



This is Awande with her mum, Yonela, who is 25 years old.

- ★ Who do you live with?
- ▶ How old are the people in your family?

## 3 AWANDE'S HOME



This is Awande's home. It is made of zinc and chip wood and is cold and lets in the rain. Awande doesn't have much space inside or outside to play safely.

- ★ How is Awande's home different to yours? What is your home made of?
- ▶ What do you think it would be like living in this home?

## 4 HELPING AT HOME



Awande helps to sweep the floor at home.

- ★ Does the broom look easy for Awande to use? Why?
- ▶ Do you do things to help out at home? What do you do?

## 5 WHAT DOES AWANDE EAT?



Awande eats porridge for breakfast. Supper is rice or samp (made from dried corn) with beans and sometimes vegetables and chicken. Awande's favourite food is chicken.

- ★ What do you eat for breakfast? Have you ever had porridge?
- ▶ What is your favourite food?

## 6 AWANDE'S PET



Awande has a pet cat called Micky. She also loves cows because she likes the mooing!

- ★ Do you have a pet? What is it? What is it called?
- ▶ What is your favourite animal? Why do you like it?

## 7 AWANDE'S FAVOURITE GAME



Awande loves pretending to cook with toy pots and pans when she is at the toy library.

- ★ What is your favourite game?
- ▶ What do you like pretending to do? Who do you like pretending to be?

## 8 PLAYING WITH FRIENDS



Awande's best friend is her cousin, who is also three years old. They like playing with a ball together.

- ★ Who are your best friends? What do you like playing with them?
- ▶ Do you think it is important that children have somewhere safe and warm to play? Why?
