There's evidence that peer-to-peer reading can bring many benefits to pupils in your school. Studies by the Educational Endowment Fund and University of Durham have shown that partnering older and younger pupils in regular one-to-one reading sessions brings lots of positive results:

- For older buddies, it reinforces what they have learnt and gives them more confidence in their reading fluency, expression and leadership skills. It also boosts their independence and interest in reading.
- For younger buddies, it can dramatically improve reading skills and help instil a positive attitude towards reading.
- For both buddies, it forges bonds of mutual respect, empathy, cooperation and understanding. It brings together children from different backgrounds. It increases trust and self-esteem, and it may provide valuable one-to-one reading time that isn't readily accessible at home. It's also something pupils really look forward to.
- For your school, peer-to-peer reading schemes like our **Storytime Reading Buddies Scheme** have been found to be an economical and effective way to improve reading results all round.



SETTING UP A READING BUDDIES SCHEME: 8 EASY STEPS

Every Reading Buddies Scheme needs a coordinator to get it started, but once it's in place, your pupils can run it themselves with you as a contact point for feedback, checking record cards or progress, and giving out reward certificates. Here's how to get your scheme started:



- 2. CONSIDER AGE GROUPS. Studies have found that paired reading with an age difference of two or more years is most effective, e.g. pairing year 6 pupils with year 4 or below. Ask teachers in lower years to identify pupils who are struggling with reading and who need help.
- 3. SET THE TIME AND DAY. Just one weekly 20-minute session can make a huge difference. Set a time and date and make sure your **Reading Buddies** know when it is. It could be during lunchtime or lessons whatever works best.
- 4. START SMALL. Kick off your Reading Buddies Scheme with just a few pairs of buddies at first and get their feedback on what works and doesn't work (is it too long, too short, the right location?) before rolling it out to more pupils.

5. CHOOSE CHAMPIONS. If your older **Reading Buddies** are willing volunteers, they will champion the scheme and inspire other pupils to take part. Remind them what a challenge it is to learn to read, so they approach the task with empathy.

6. FIND THE RIGHT PAIRS. Some studies have found that same-sex pairing works best, but personality is a factor too. If there's a clash, you can always swap pairs around. It's a good idea to change partners every term and have back-up **Reading Buddies** to cover absenteeism.

7. REWARD PROGRESS. Use our Reading Buddy Reward Certificates to help buddies stay motivated.

8. USE STORYTIME. Storytime automatically gives you a variety of stories to choose from to suit a wide range of tastes. It's got myths and legends, fairy tales, fables, folk tales, stories from around the world, contemporary stories and poems. But have a variety of books on hand too!

10 TOP TIPS FOR OLDER STORYTIME READING BUDDIES

1. How you read is up to you – you can read to your younger buddy, they can read to you, or you can take it in turns.

- 2. Use lots of expression to make the story interesting. Remember to get louder or faster in exciting, dramatic bits and use funny voices too.
- 3. Before you start reading, look at the story title and pictures together. Can your buddy predict what will happen in the story?
- 4. Before you turn a page, see if your buddy can guess what happens next. Were they right?

- **5.** At the end of a story, talk to each other about your favourite parts and why you liked them.
- **6.** Ask questions to check whether your buddy understands the story. For example, "Why do you think he did that?"



7. Stop every now and again and point at a word. See if your younger buddy can say it for you.



8. If your buddy isn't enjoying a story, try a different one. There are lots to choose from in Storytime!

9. If your buddy gets stuck on a word, don't tell them what it is right away.

Encourage them to work it out by sounding out the letters or see if they can guess what it is by reading the whole sentence. If not, praise them for trying so hard, and tell them what the word is.

10. Use our **Reading Buddies** drawing, writing and storyboard sheets to draw a picture or write a mini story for each other before your next meeting!
